Malin Head
Rugged yet inviting, Donegal's Malin Head, Ireland's most northerly Point, is steeped in history and offers activities such as walking, fishing, swimming and bird watching. Here, north of Trawbreaga Bay, you can view Five Finger Strand, home to some of Europe's largest sand dunes.
