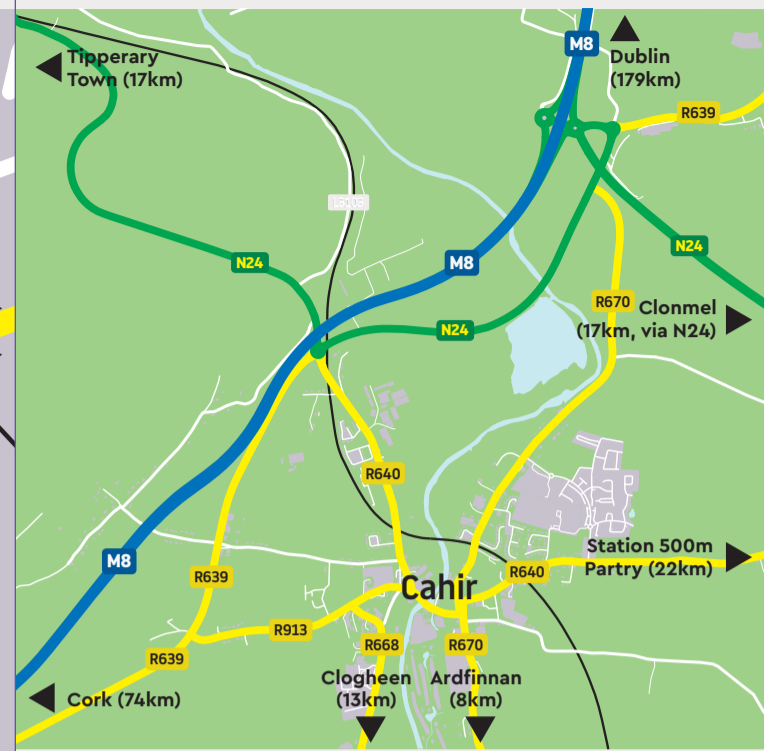
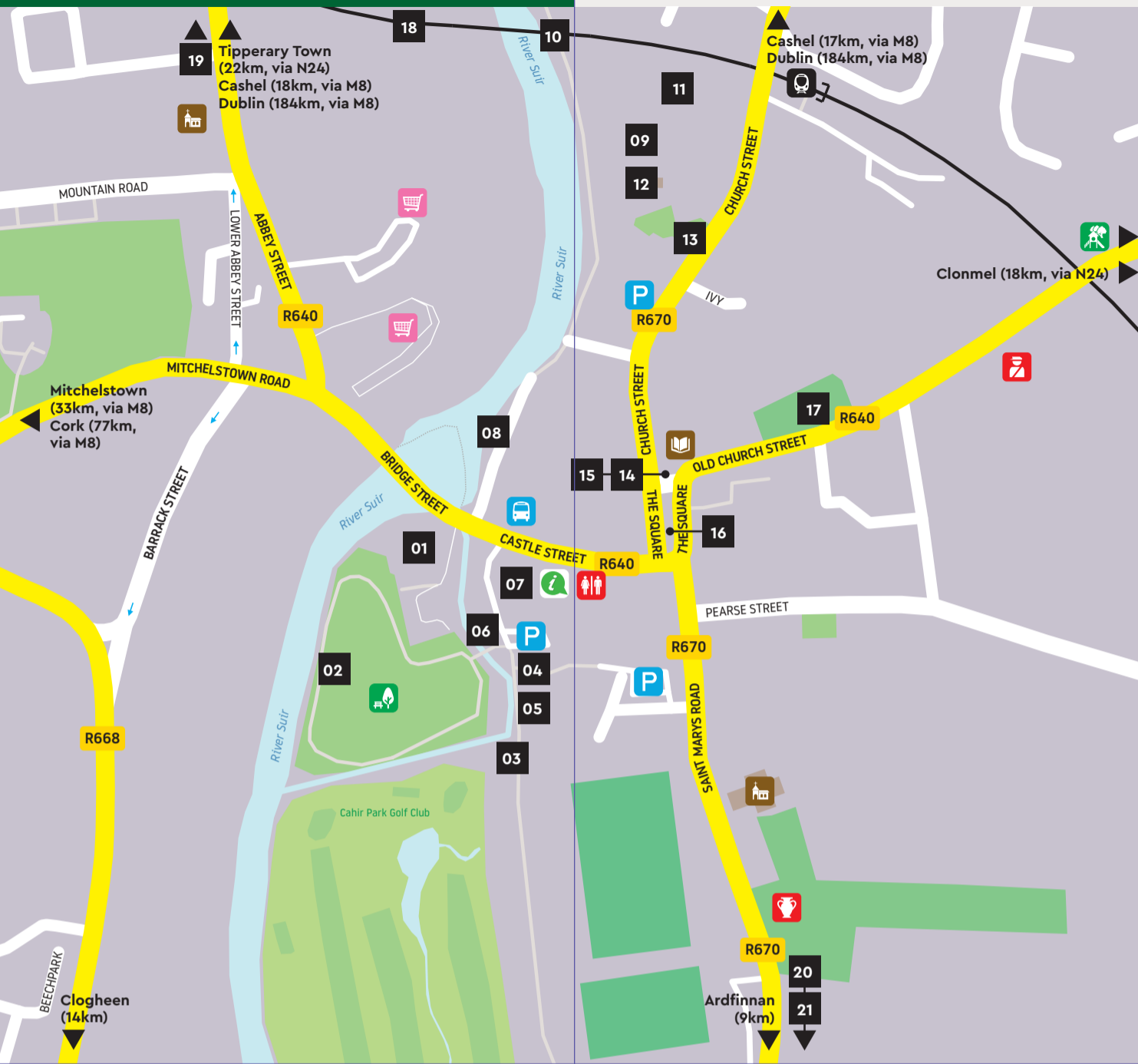

# Keep Discovering Cahir



## Discover More

**Cahir** Situated in the south of County Tipperary between the Galtee and Knockmealdown Mountains, the heritage town of Cahir is a treasure trove. Standing proudly on the banks of the River Suir, visit the 13th century Cahir Castle, one of Ireland's largest and best preserved castles. Stroll from the castle along the Coronation Walk for 2km to find nestled in the woods, the fairy-tale Swiss Cottage. A delightful ornamental cottage built in the early 1800s, offering an informative guided tour of the beautifully decorated interior. The Mitchelstown Caves, 16km from Cahir, is one of the largest and most complex cave systems in Ireland. Take a guided tour through the ancient passageways and visit the massive caverns.

**History & Heritage** The landscape of Tipperary is dotted with a series of magnificent castles, houses, abbeys and churches. The iconic Rock of Cashel, 19km north from Cahir is a cluster of medieval buildings including a round tower, a high cross, a Romanesque chapel, a Gothic cathedral, an abbey, the Hall of the Vicars Choral and a 15th century Tower House. Discover centuries of drama, romance, intrigue and deadly rivalries as you follow in the footsteps of the powerful Butler dynasty on the Butler Trail. Visit impressive sites such as Ormond Castle in Carrick-on-Suir, the Main Guard in Clonmel in the south of the county and Nenagh and Roscrea Castles in the north. The abbeys of Holycross, Athassel and Hore near Cashel cannot be missed. Explore the town of Thurles set in the beautiful Suir Valley, the founding place of the GAA and home to the Lár na Pairc GAA museum. Fethard town, in the east of the county has the most complete medieval town walls in Ireland. Follow the Fethard medieval trail to see all this unique walled town has to offer.

**The Great Outdoors** Cahir and the county of Tipperary has so much to offer lovers of the great outdoors. The Suir Blueway is a 53km kayaking and canoe trail from Cahir to Carrick-on-Suir and a 21km walking and cycling trail from Clonmel to Carrick-on-Suir along the beautiful River Suir. It is the perfect way to experience Tipperary's beautiful countryside and rich cultural heritage. Close to Cahir, take forest walks in Scaragh Woods and Glengarra Woods, hike the majestic Galtee Mor or take a short drive to explore the natural beauty and heritage of the Glen of Aherlow. The Glen of Aherlow can be explored by car, foot, bike and on horseback. Take a step back in time and follow St. Declan's Way, a 96km route linking the ancient ecclesiastical centres of Ardmore in County Waterford and Cashel in County Tipperary. North of the county, the Silvermine Mountains and the legendary Devil's Bit are great for an exhilarating hike, enjoying breath taking views of the surrounding countryside. Lough Derg, where counties Clare, Galway and Tipperary meet, has not only stunning views but is where you can follow the 160km water trails of the Lough Derg Blueway. Take to the water by boat, canoe, kayak or paddle board or explore some of the best walking routes in the country.

**Crossroads of the South** Cahir is perfectly positioned at the junction of the main routes from Dublin to Cork and Limerick to Waterford. County Tipperary is bordered by eight counties – Cork, Waterford, Kilkenny, Laois, Offaly, Galway, Clare and Limerick, making it a great base to keep discovering.
