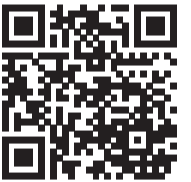


TOWN MAP

Discover More

The Great Western Greenway is a 43.5km cycling and walking route between Westport and Achill Island mainly traffic free which primarily follows the famous Great Western Midlands Railway. The official access point is signposted approximately 500m from Westport town centre just off the N59 travelling in the direction of Newport. The Greenway traverses Ireland's Atlantic coast passing through picturesque villages of Newport and Mulranny. Bike hire is available in Westport check out www.greenway.ie

Westport House is situated in a 400-acre woodland estate adjacent to the town. Explore the House and the Pirate Adventure Park, which is mainly suitable for younger children. Pedestrian access from Church Street in the town centre is just a short 10minute walk. Access by car is from the Quay and the Newport Road with ample parking areas. It is free to walk through the estate or around the gardens of Westport House.

Westport Quay is just 2km from the town centre. With its own identity the Quay is home to pubs, restaurants and some shops. The bathing area there is extremely popular. Parking at the Quay is pay and display.

Croagh Patrick is located in Murrisk, 9km from Westport town centre heading on the R335. The walk to the summit takes roughly two hours. Some people may require walking sticks which are available in the Community Café in the pay and display car park. Walk 10 minutes to the 1st statue and experience the amazing view of Clew Bay islands. There are two pubs serving food in the village. The National Famine Monument is located opposite the car park. Nearby is Murrisk Abbey while Bertra Beach is 2km away.

Clare Island & Inishturk Islands can be reached daily by passenger ferry from Roonagh Pier, near Louisburgh. Roonagh Pier is 30km from Westport. Accommodation and dining options are available on both islands. There are

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no shortage of walking routes and spectacular viewing areas. Bike hire is available on Clare Island. It is possible to do day trips to both islands in the summer months.

Doolough Valley & Killybeg Harbour: Head west on the R335 from Westport along the Wild Atlantic Way within an 80km drive discover the spectacular beauty of the Doolough Valley & Killybeg Harbour. En route take in the lovely villages of Murrisk, Louisburgh and Leenaun.

Achill Island: It is possible to drive onto Achill Island. It is 40km north west of Westport on the N59 and is Ireland's largest island. Some of Europe's highest cliffs are in Achill while its beaches and blanket bogs are mesmerizingly beautiful. Visit Mayo's only aquarium. No visit to Achill would be complete without a drive to Keem Beach, a Wild Atlantic Way Signature Point.

Wild Nephin Ballycroy National Park comprises of 11,000 hectares of Atlantic Blanket Bog and mountainous terrain, covering a vast uninhabited and unspoiled wilderness with spectacular views. Leaving Westport head north west on the N59 for 45km along the Wild Atlantic Way. You can easily spend a few hours in the Interpretative Centre. There is a café on site and plenty of parking. The walks are very short, not wet underfoot and suitable for young children.

The National Museum of Ireland – Country Life: The museum is situated in the grounds of Turlough Park House, a short distance from the town of Castlebar, on the N5 and can also be accessed from the Castlebar Greenway. The museum is free of charge. The park offers beautiful lake views and walks, a great playground with café and souvenir shop plus ample free parking.
