I am an excellent swimmer. I have strong, webbed feet and I can close my ears and nose to keep the water out.



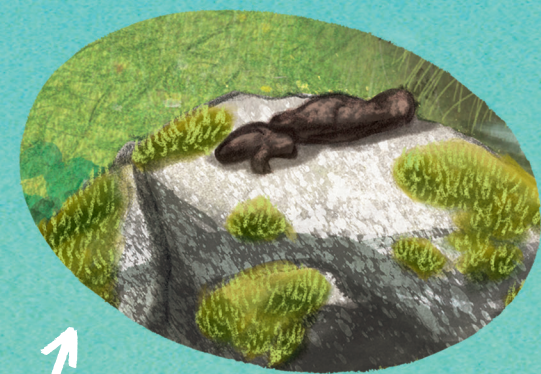
My home is a cosy underground burrow called a holt.



Otter babies, known as kits, stay in the holt until they are old enough to swim.



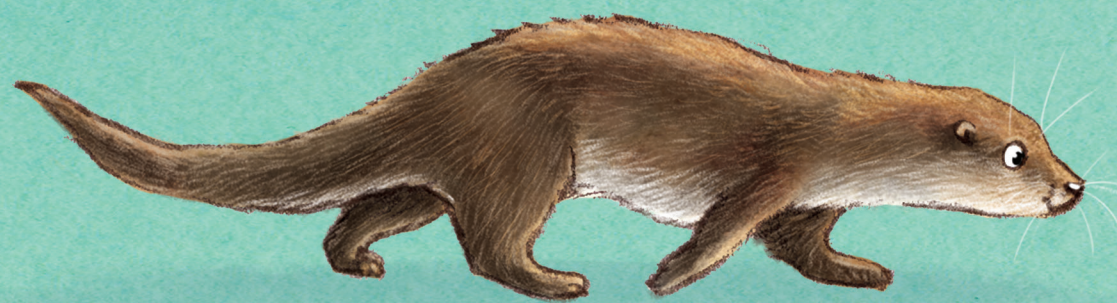
There are fourteen different types of otter. When sea otters sleep they hold paws to stop them drifting apart.
