Some fun tips to help little ones develop their motor skills and enjoy reading together!

Read the story aloud several times. Books that rhyme help young children to focus on words as well as pictures.

If something in the book catches their attention, talk about it together.

Let little ones move the mechanisms as much as they want – tactile books aid brain development and memory.

Take time looking at the pictures in the book and ask questions about what they can see.

Stories help develop knowledge of the world and build empathy. Once you've read the book together, let them explore it on their own.

Remember, there is no right or wrong way to read a book. Preschoolers have short attention spans, so go with the flow!
